Local Parents Invited to Water Safety Class At Connections Education Center

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla., Nov. 14, 2022 -- More children ages 1 to 4 years drown in Florida than in any other state, according to the <u>Florida Department of Health</u>. For children with autism, drowning is the <u>top cause of death</u>.

That's why two local organizations are teaming up to present a free class where parents and caregivers can learn the latest strategies for keeping children safe near water.

This free program -- called the ABCD's of Water Safety -- will be held Thursday, Nov. 17, 2023, 9:30-10:30 a.m. at Connections Education Center in West Palm Beach. Attendees can also choose to attend remotely via Google Meet.

Experts from both organizations will teach parents:

- important safeguards to lower the chance of drowning
- how to handle a water emergency
- why you should never rely on arm floaties
- and much more

Parents will also learn how to access a voucher for swim lessons from the Drowning Prevention Coalition.

"In Palm Beach County, we're surrounded by water. Even if you don't have a pool or live near the ocean, it's essential for your child to learn to swim," says Katie Wentley, Director of Health, Wellness & Aquatics at Connections Education Center. "Children can drown in a matter of minutes. They must learn how to stay safe around water and how to get to safety in a water emergency."

Connections Education Center is a local charter school that serves children with autism. The school includes adaptive swim lessons for every student as part of their curriculum.
